

service. Two guitars furnished the music for a half a dozen songs. There were about six in the congregation plus ourselves. Some prayers or exclamations - repetition of "Hosanna", many times just the name Jesus. The minister interrupted now and then with some remark. Then came the more particular petitions. Here the minister prayed, though with some help. One child was sick + they put oil on a handkerchief & prayed. The minister's wife would take it to the child + cure it. Several reports of healing. The session was on Jan 7: 31-ff

The minister would read a verse, give several irrelevant illustrations, chiefly on Christian morality - and it was not at all bad. He must have preached 45 min., using mainly his experiences in the construction business - Obviously he received no salary from the congregation. No offering was taken. I spoke to him at the end & he said the people left their gifts on the Bible. Which I did. Earlier he asked the visitors for a testimony & I gave part of the dice sermon. On the whole the service was better than I expected - only too long 10 AM to noon.

We then drove toward Phoenix - 45 min. before finding a restaurant. We passed the development advertised in Ads'ls. It would be better & cheaper to build in cottonwood - but both places are pretty bleak.

After lunch we drove through Phoenix & east to Spade junction. If there were no motels there we could drive ten miles back again - plenty of motels in mesa. At the junction there is a luxury motel. In winter their prices must be high. Their dinners now are 3⁰⁰ + up. But a second floor motel room, no TV, was now ~~\$9⁰⁰~~
and it was a lovely room.



On road to Hawntville we saw 2 adjacent buttes -

They looked about 5 miles, maybe 6 or 7, ahead.

By odometer reading they were 13. (near Hobin)
valley

The burnt sienna base became light, very light raw sienna, & even rusty green in top layers.

From I 70 down is relatively flat. The valley is green with clumps, some bluish green, but open pea green. A few patches of bare red sand, sculptured by the wind into tiny ridges. The sky was flecked with white clouds. Fairly dark purple at zenith, to very light cerulean or greenish blue at horizon. No green above 30° above horizon - light pure ultramarine

We arrived in Capitol Reef c 10:30. After visiting the Ranger Station, with 7 min. film, we went to Branc wash & Capitol Gorge. The dirt road was very dusty. Capitol Gorge is a wash that has cliffs 50 ft or so at the narrows. We ate lunch under a nice roof & nicely laid

stone walls, 2 ft high - no tables or water.

After lunch we took a room for 2 nights.

Then we started up the trail to Hickman Natural Bridge

Exactly one mile from road. It took us exactly
one hour; up the face of a cliff in sharp steep
switch backs, then up the side of the mt.,
fairly steep at times, even down again, over
rough stones & soft fine sand for sketches. We
met about 6 other hikers going & coming.

Our return trip took less than 40 minutes.

To supper at our motel. I had a 3.50 dinner,
coffee 25¢ extra.

Sat Aug 11th

In the morning the Ranger conducted a tour for the tourists - just us two. We climbed around up to top of cliff to see Chimney Rock from above. The climb was steep, but perhaps not so arduous as Hickman Bridge. Usually the tourists make a small circle or loop. But when we got to the high point we came down again. It was a little over a mile up. Took pictures of some dead trees, a wash we climbed though. The ranger pointed out the general geological formation for 20 miles around.

Lunch in picnic park - well watered grass, fine trees. I lay down while Ruth went 15 m to Ricknell for gas & groceries - she got the gas! The groceries were minimal. Afterward we took the very short trip to view the goosenecks of Sulphur Creek - runs into Fremont river. The gorge is tremendous, winding for miles. Then we came back

To the picnic park & I sketched a little. Then supper. After supper, sitting in front of our room, the back of the motel, by Sulphur Creek, we saw two small mule deer. Birds seem scarce.

Sunday we rested - I was tired enough. Wrote to Schuyler & Harry Kerr. Took a nap. Sat.

Mon. 13. another deer before breakfast
Left Capitol Reef 22 853 9:20 A.M.
We drove straight (around) to Moab & took a motel about noon. ate in room. Went to Arches. Got a 1973 pass to all Natl Parks. Drove to Window Section, climbed to North Window, from which I drew ~~the~~ Turret Arch. Climbed for a view of the Delicate Arch. Then to end of road & back to Visitors Center. ate in same restaurant as last time - same motel too.

* The temperature at the Visitor's Center was 107° but I sat in the shade of the bridge & there was a breeze while I drew.

Tuesday, June 11

Good night. Left 7:55 - westward.
