1	OVERTURE 14 from Providence Presbytery (to CCB, OC)
2	"Amend BCO 35-1 to Require Accused Officers to Testify"
3	
4	Be it resolved, that Providence Presbytery overtures the 44 th General Assembly to amend
5	BCO 35-1 as follows:
6	
7	Strike all of BCO 35-1
8	35-1. All persons of proper age and intelligence are competent witnesses,
9	except such as do not believe in the existence of God, or a future state of
10	rewards and punishments. The accused party may be allowed, but shall not be
11	compelled to testify; but the accuser shall be required to testify, on the
12	demand of the accused. Either party has the right to challenge a witness
13	whom he believes to be incompetent, and the court shall examine and decide
14	upon his competency. It belongs to the court to judge the degree of credibility
15	to be attached to all evidence.
16	
17	And replace with:
18	35.1. All persons of proper age and intelligence are competent witnesses,
19	except such as do not believe in the existence of God, or a future state of
20	rewards and punishments;
21	a. In general, the accused party may be allowed, but shall not be
22	compelled, to testify. However, because of the relationship of
23	mutual accountability between church officers and the church
24	created in the voluntary affirmation of ordination vows, church
25	officers under accusation with regard to doctrinal views shall be
26	required to testify before the court of original jurisdiction. Such
27	officers may remain present during the testimony of all other
28	witnesses (BCO 35-4).
29	b. The accuser shall be required to testify, on the demand of the
30	accused.
31	c. Either party has the right to challenge a witness whom he believes
32	to be incompetent, and the court shall examine and decide upon his
33	<u>competency.</u>
34	d. It belongs to the court to judge the degree of credibility to be
35	attached to all evidence.

Grounds:

Requiring officers to testify in cases involving doctrinal issues is consistent with our constitution;

Church officers are required to explain and defend their doctrine when seeking admission to serve under the jurisdiction of another court (e.g. *BCO* 13-6);

1	Church officers are required by their ordination vows to come forward and make known any
2	way in which their views might have become out of accord with any of the fundamentals of
3	our system of doctrine (e.g. BCO 21-5.2.);
4	
5	Church officers are in the nature of the case continually obliged to voluntarily have their
6	doctrine subject to legitimate scrutiny (1 Tim. 4:16; 1 Tim. 5:22; Acts 20:28-30);
7	
8	A rule relieving all accused persons from an obligation to testify, as does the current <i>BCO</i>
9	35-1, undermines the responsibilities of our courts of original jurisdiction and our officers
10	(cf. <i>BCO</i> 31-2);
11	Dequipment about the files of the testify in access concerning their destrine is consistent with the
12 13	Requiring church officers to testify in cases concerning their doctrine is consistent with the Scripture and the Westminster Standards:
14	Scripture and the Westminster Standards.
15	(1) 2 Cor. 1:17-18; Prov. 15:23, 25:11, 28:13; Gen 4:9; Job 31:22-27; Ps. 15:1-2,
16	32:3; Dt 19:15-19;
17	(2) WLC #144, describing the duties required in the ninth commandment:
18	The duties required in the ninth commandment are appearing and
19	standing for the truth; and from the heart, sincerely, freely, clearly, and
20	fully, speaking the truth, and only the truth, in matters of judgment and
21	justice, and in all other things whatsoever;
22	(3) WLC #145
23	The sins forbidden in the ninth commandment are, all prejudicing the
24	truth, and the good name of our neighbors, as well as our own,
25	especially in public judicature; forgery, concealing the truth, undue
26	silence in a just cause, and holding our peace when iniquity calleth for
27	either a reproof from ourselves, or a complaint to others;
28	(4) WCF XXX and XXXI
29	The limitation of this overture to matters of doctrine limits the concern that the
30	requirement to testify would cause any direct civil or criminal jeopardy to the
31	officer.
